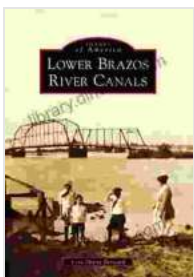

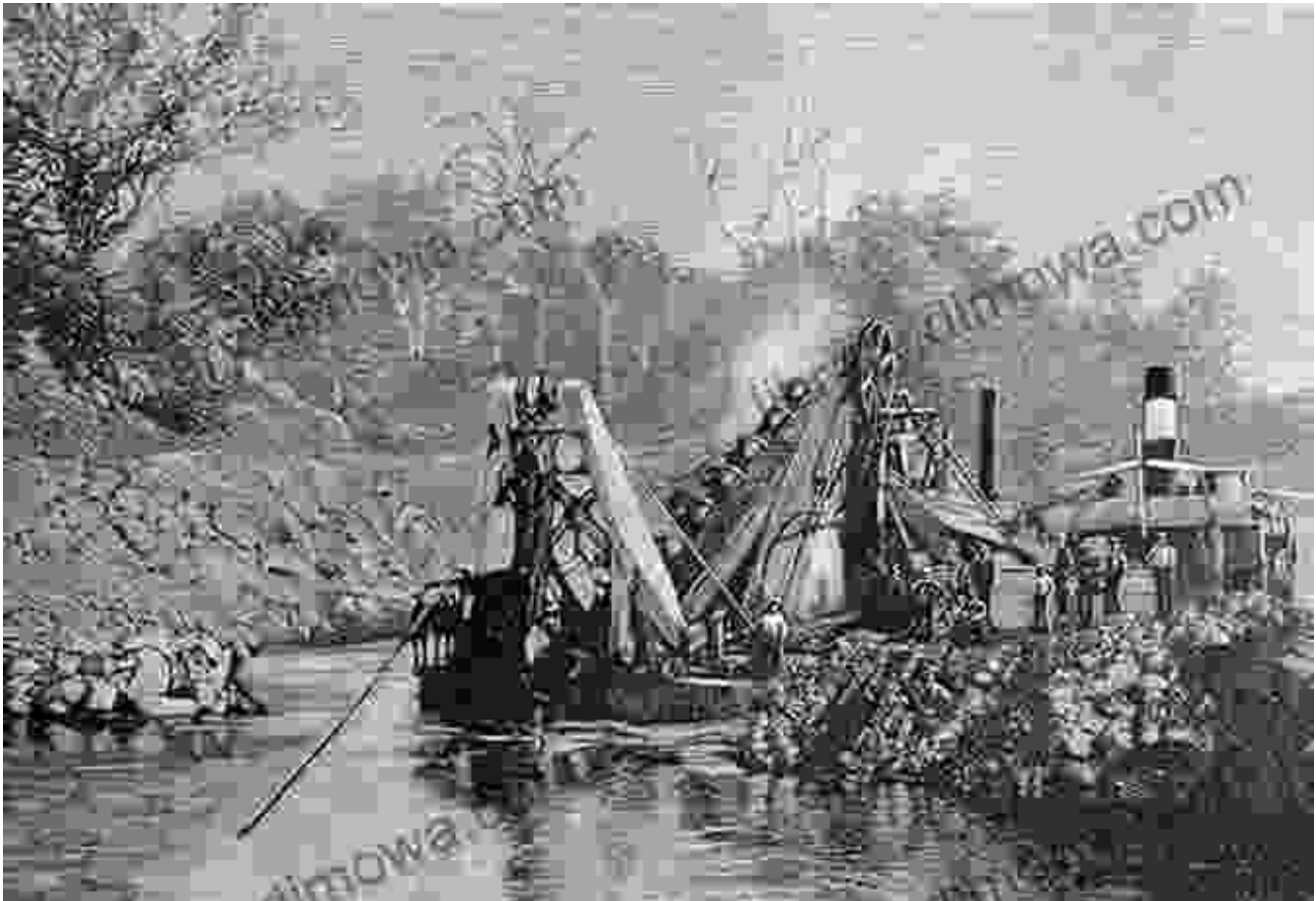

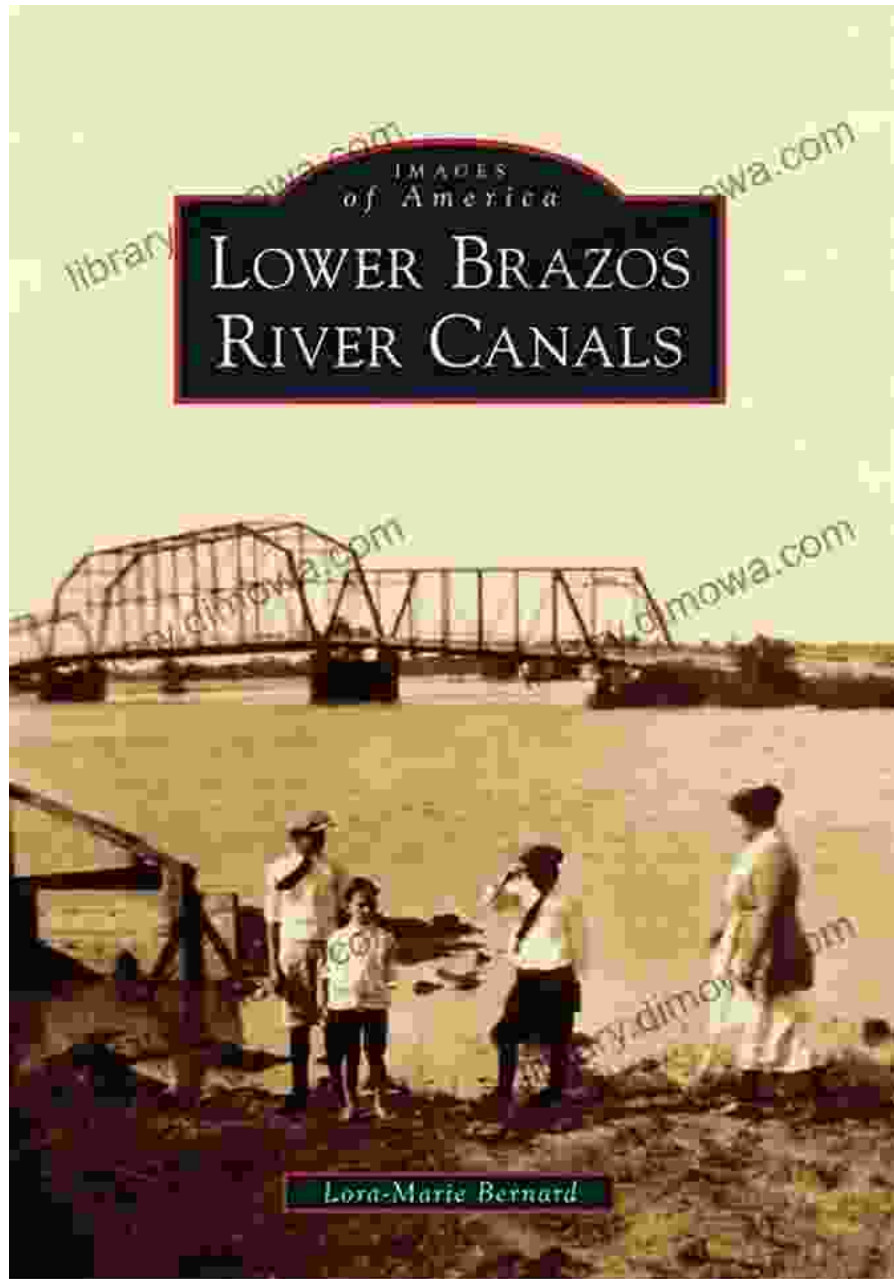


Figure 2: Steamboats, the workhorses of the canals, played a vital role in transporting goods and people throughout the region

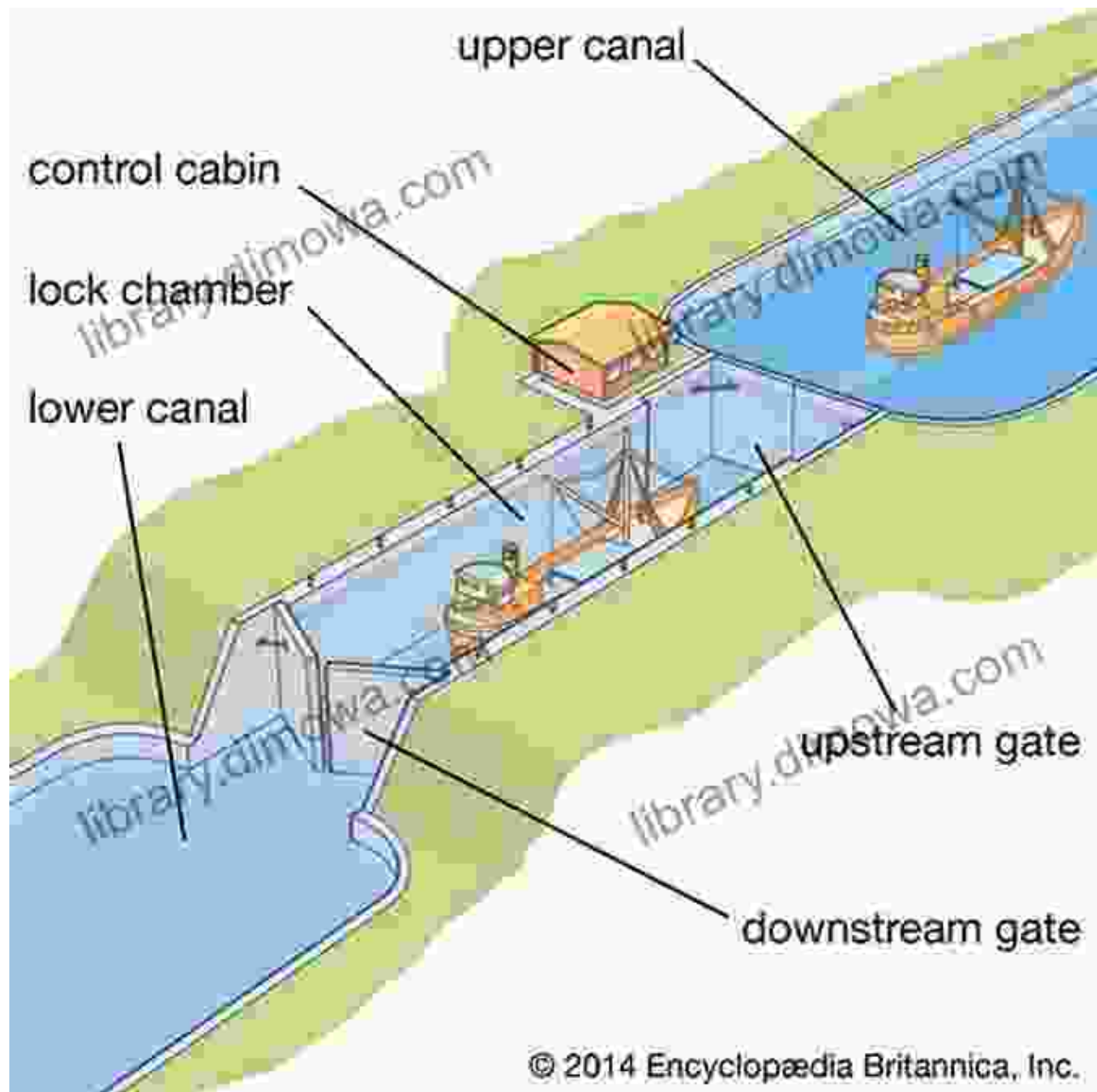


Figure 4: Canal locks symbolized the ingenuity and skill of the engineers who harnessed the river's power

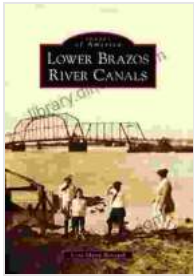
