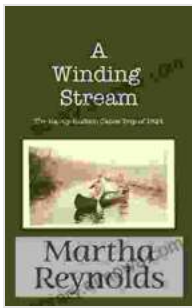


Winding Stream: The Handy Hudson Canoe Trip 1924
